### 1. What Wedding Stationery Do I Need?

Here's a list of stationery items you might want to consider:

Before the Wedding

Save the Dates - Invitations - RSVP Cards Details/Enclosure Cards - Belly Bands - Envelope Liners

On the Day

Ceremony Booklets - Welcome Signs - Seating Charts Table Numbers - Menu Cards - Place Cards

After the Wedding

Thank-You Cards

Tip: Not every wedding needs every piece—choose what fits your celebration and budget.

## 5. How Many Invitations Should I Order?

Don't order based on guest headcount—order based on households/couples.

Example: 150 guests = ~80-90 invitations

Always order 10–15 extra for keepsakes, calligraphy mistakes, and any last-minute additions.

# 6. Tips to Save Money Without Sacrificing Style

Use digital RSVP instead of printed

Choose a single insert card with a QR code linking to your wedding website

Simplify embellishments (e.g., printed monogram instead of wax seal)

#### 7. Common Mistakes to Avoid

Ordering too late-rush fees can be expensive

Forgetting postage costs

Not triple-checking wording & guest names

#### 2. When Should I Order?

Here's a suggested timeline to keep you stress-free:

Tip:

Allow extra time if you have custom illustrations, letterpress, or international guests.

# 3. What Should Be Included in My Invitation Suite?

A basic invitation suite usually includes:

Main invitation

RSVP card

Details card

(accommodations, website, dress code, etc.)

# Optional extras:

Envelope liner Wax seal Ribbon or belly band to hold everything together

#### 4. How to Word Your Invitations

There's no one "right" way to word an invitation, but here's a classic example:

Together with their families
Emma Rose Smith
and
Liam James Bennett
request the honour of your presence
at their wedding celebration
Saturday, the twenty-fourth of May
Two thousand twenty-five
at half past three in the afternoon
Willowbrook Gardens
Reception to follow
